



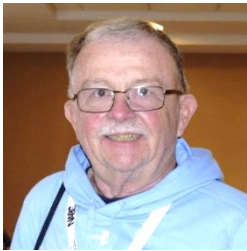
HOOP HISTORIANS KEEP BUSY ACROSS THE COUNTRY
