Bill Carsley was a member of the Hoop Historians since 2000 and attended 43 Final Fours over 44 years, from 1976-2019.



Bill was a long-time season ticket holder for the Chicago Cubs, Chicago Bears, DePaul Basketball and Northwestern Football.





Carsley was a high school coach and enjoyed a lengthy career as a lawyer with the City of Chicago until his retirement in 2009.



Bill also worked in the sports departments of the Chicago Tribune, Chicago American and City News Bureau of Chicago.



Carsley is a three-time graduate of DePaul University earning his Bachelor, Masters and Law Degrees.



Bill was enshrined into the DePaul University Hall of Fame in 2008 for his contributions to the school's athletic programs.





Carsley was the former chairperson of the Chicago Bar Association Sports Law Committee.



Bill attended the Super Bowl 11 different times and the Summer Olympics in 1976, 1984 and 1996.



Bill attended every game of the Big East tournament from 2006 to 2019 in Madison Square Garden.



Carsley served and was honorably discharged from the U.S. Army.
