#### HONORARY HOOP HISTORIAN AL BENNINGER 1926-2025



Hoop Historian Al Benninger passed away at age 99. A fixture at the NCAA Final Four that spanned over five

decades, Benninger was the captain of the University of Louisville Stat Crew, which has worked every NCAA Championship since 1969. Benninger also worked as chief statistician for Louisville football since 1961, ABA basketball for the Kentucky Colonels, 13 consecutive NCAA Division II Championships and nine Orange Bowls. Besides having the best seat in the house for athletic events, Al liked to participate as well, as he was a Senior Olympic Champion winning the Golden 100 and 200 Meter Dashes several times over numerous years. Benninger started playing slow-pitch softball in 1954 and served as commissioner of the Louisville Senior Softball League at Louisville Metro Parks for many years. For his efforts with the group, the softball field at Camp Taylor Park was named Αl Benninger Field. Benninger was selected as an Honorary Member of the Hoop Historians in April, 2010.
