BASKETBALL HALL OF FAMERS REUNITE AFTER 50 YEARS

Hoop Historian John Mayberry saw a familiar face in the audience at a recent basketball clinic he was speaking at this summer. It was none other than Linda Sharp. the former collegiate and professional womens' basketball coach. Other than both being Hall of Famers. Mayberry had a special connection to Sharp, as he was her high school counselor 50 years ago at John F. Kennedy High School in LaPalma, California. Sharp's coaching career spanned from elementary school, junior high, high school, college and the professional ranks. She was the head coach of the USC Ladv Trojans, which won back-to-back NCAA titles in 1983 and 1984. And Sharp was the first-ever head coach of the WNBA's Los Angeles Sparks. The two recalled a story when Coach Mayberry once caught Sharp cutting class and he made her do push-ups.
