MOORPARK HOOPSTERS MAKE HISTORY ON COURT

Congratulations go out to the Moorpark College Raiders Womens' Basketball



team, which won 32 games this past season and played in the State Championship California game, receiving their first state finals berth in 22 years. The team was ranked #1 in the state since early January. The Raiders set a school record for wins in a season while reaching the CCCAA State Championships for the first time since 1997. Moorpark was beaten in the title game 68-61 by Diablo Valley College. Freshman Breanna Calhoun was named CCCWBCA Player of the Year and head coach Kenny Plummer was selected as Coach of the Year in the South Region. Hoop Historian Vern Vegso serves the school as Special Assistant to the Athletic Director.

Minneapolis hosted the Final Four in 2001 and 1992. Duke won the title both years. Games were played in the now demolished Hubert H Humphrey Metrodome.
