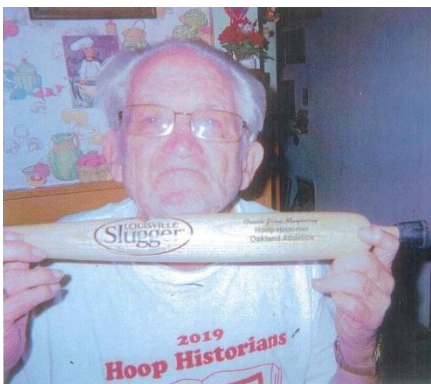

This month's edition of the Hoop Historians News is an all pictorial issue of the summer travels of the group.



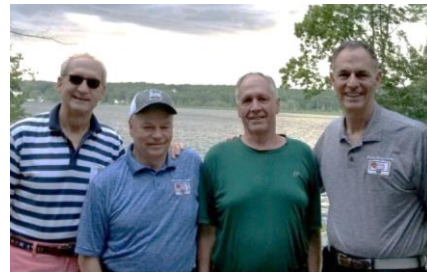
Kevin McCann visited the Womens' Basketball Hall of Fame in Knoxville, Tennessee.

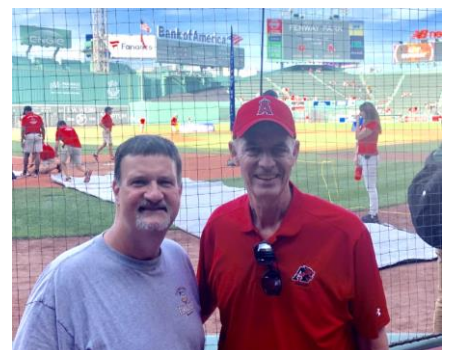
Harvard's Director of Strength and Conditioning James Frazier along with Hoop Historian Joe Spagnolo, who coached Frazier in high school.
