HOOP HISTORIANS DUO SEES MORE FOOTBALL HISTORY



Hoop Historians Dorothy Kim and Ted Reineking have seen their share of USC-Notre Dame football games over the years. This year's matchup of the Trojans and Fighting Irish marked the 45th time Dorothy has seen the two teams play and it was the 25th matchup attended for Reineking. Among Dorothy's most memorable games are her first USC-ND meeting in 1967 which was the Trojans first win in South Bend since 1939; and "The Comeback" in 1974. where Southern Cal rallied from a 24-7 halftime deficit to win 55-24. Some of Ted's favorite games included the 1973 Notre Dame victory over unbeaten USC, who was the defending National Champs, where Reineking rushed the field after the game and shook hands with Irish guarterback Tommy Clemens; and the "Green Jersey Game" in 1977 as the Notre Dame players warmed up in their traditional blue and gold jerseys but came out of the locker room in green jerseys en route to a 49-19 victory. Both Kim and Reineking also had the 2005 "Bush Push" game on their list as among their most memorable. USC won the game in the final seconds when Reggie Bush pushed quarterback Matt Leinart across the goal line for the 34-31 victory in a crazed environment which saw more than 120,000 people on campus. Notre Dame defeated Southern Cal 30-27 in this year's contest.
