

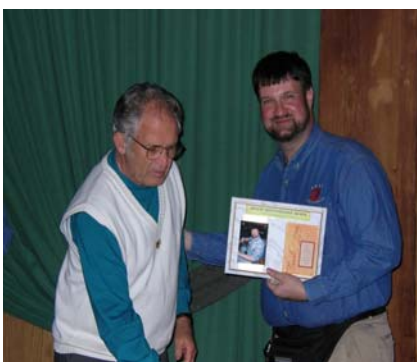


## HOOP HISTORIANS RECOGNIZED

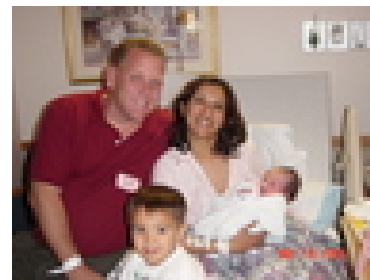
