HOOP HISTORIANS TO PASS 500 FINALS MARK

The twenty-two person membership of the Hoop Historians has amassed 484 Final Fours between them. The group will expect to eclipse the 500 mark of total Final Fours attended this year in San Antonio. Leading the way is the Dean of the Hoop Historians, Brian Burmeister, who will be attending his 45th NCAA championship, and 42nd consecutive. Hoop Historian John Mayberry is scheduled to be at his 40th Final Four this April. He first attended the NCAA finals in 1958 in Louisville.
