Among the future major leaguers he saw early in their careers included Paul Molitor and Dave Winfield. Hum was always willing to share an anecdote or two from his past experiences with the Hoop Historians at the annual Pitch & Hit Club Banquet. Hum lived on the same street for all but one year of his long life and had been in the house that his uncle built since he was a boy.
