## NCAA TOURNEY SITES TO BE ANNOUNCED

Sixty cities are competing for the 36 available spots to host first/second round and Regional games for the NCAA Basketball Tournament in 2011, 2012 and 2013. Those winning cities will be announced in September, during the NCAA's Championships Sports Management Cabinet meeting. Three cities should be a shoe-in for Regional selection, as New Orleans, Atlanta and Arlington (TX) will host Final Fours from 2012-2014. Traditionally Final Four cities will get to host a Regional in the year prior to the Final Four. The list of cities that have applied for consideration includes places where a number of new arenas are planned to open in time for the three year cycle of post-season play. Among them, are two on-campus facilities, the new Auburn Arena in Alabama and the Matthew Knight Arena on the University of Oregon. Municipal facilities that are in the bidding process, and will be opening over the next few years, include the Intrust Bank Arena in Wichita, Kansas, a 15,000 seat facility; the Amway Orlando Events Center, which is part of a 1.05 billion dollar plan that includes a basketball arena, performing arts theater and expansion of the Citrus Bowl: and Louisville's downtown arena. which will seat 22,000 people and will be the fifth largest college basketball arena in the nation. That facility has already received a bid to host the 2012 NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball Final Four. Even Madison Square Garden, which hasn't hosted a NCAA Tournament event since 1961, and is undergoing a 500 million dollar renovation project that should be ready by 2012; has thrown it's hat into the ring for future March Madness games. Since 2000, the current Hoop Historians membership has visited 27 different cities to see NCAA Tournament games.
