HOOP HISTORIANS NET FIFTH HALL OF FAMER IN 4 YEARS



For the fifth time since 2007, a member of the Hoop Historians has been recognized as being named to a Hall of Fame group. This year, Hoop Historians

Executive Director Joe Spagnolo has been honored as being selected to the Illinois Basketball Coaches Hall of Fame. Spagnolo joins four other Hoop Historians that achieved Hall of Fame status over the past three years: Fred Allman, Bill Carsley, Kevin McCann and **Dennis Mishko**. Spagnolo has been tournament administrator of the Proviso West Holiday Tournament since the early 1980's, and has been a referee assignor and sideline official for three decades. Induction ceremonies will take place in April after the Final Four. In addition to the five members listed above, Hoop Historians Cal Dilworth and John Mayberry have also been inducted into various Hall of Fames as well.
