200 AND COUNTING

To say that Hoop Historian **Ted Reineking** is a Notre Dame football fan would be an understatement. Ted recently attended his 200th game at Notre Dame Stadium and saw the Irish win a triple overtime thriller against Pitt. Reineking has seen 142 Notre Dame victories in South Bend dating back almost 50 years. Below are highlights of Ted's Excellent Adventure of Fighting Irish football through the years.



Notre Dame's record in home games in which Ted Reineking has attended:

Ted's First Game: 10/12/1963 – Irish upset defending National Champion USC 17-14.

Among Ted's Most Memorable Games:

10/22/1977 – ND upsets #5 USC and go on to win National Title. Irish warm up in traditional blue & gold uniforms, but start the game in green jerseys and trounce the Trojans 49-19.

10/15/1988 – Fourth ranked Irish upset #1 Miami 31-30 and go on to win the National Championship.

11/14/1992 – Irish beat Penn State 17-16 in the "Snow Bowl". ND scores in last 20 seconds and then converts the game winning two point conversion for the victory.

NCAA ANNOUNCES EARLY ROUND FUTURE SITES

Locations of early round NCAA games through 2015 have been released. Second and third round games in 2014 will be held in Buffalo, Milwaukee. Orlando. Spokane. Raleigh, San Antonio, San Diego and Saint Louis. 2014 Regionals be located in Anaheim. Memphis, Indianapolis and New York. In 2015, opening weekend games are slated for Jacksonville, Louisville. Pittsburgh, Portland. Charlotte, Columbus, Omaha and Seattle. Regionals in 2015 will be played in Cleveland, Los Angeles, Houston and Syracuse. The midweek First Four round games will continue to be held in Dayton. Finals Fours for these years will be held in Houston in 2014 and Indianapolis in 2015.
