DARREN SACK SELECTED BY GIANTS IN 11th ROUND



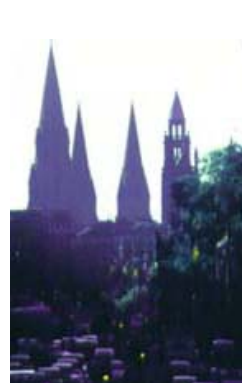

Another Sonoma State student received high recognition as pitcher Darren Sack was drafted in the 11th round of the Major League Baseball Draft by the San Francisco Giants. Darren is the son of Hoop Historian Al and Nancy Sack and was a Second Team All-West Region and All-California Collegiate Athletic Association pick this past year. Darren went 9-3 with a 3.14 ERA for the Sonoma Seawolves and had a school-record 93 strikeouts in 2004 and is second in school history with 24 career wins. Sonoma State was one of just ten schools in the entire nation at any level that had four players taken in the top twelve rounds of this year's MLB draft. Since the draft, the six-foot, four-inch right-hander has been assigned to the Class "A" Salem-Keizer Volcanoes team in Oregon. Congratulations Darren and good luck!
